

DECLARE VALUE MARKINGS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF SAN MARCOS IN THE YEARS BETWEEN 1949 AND 1958

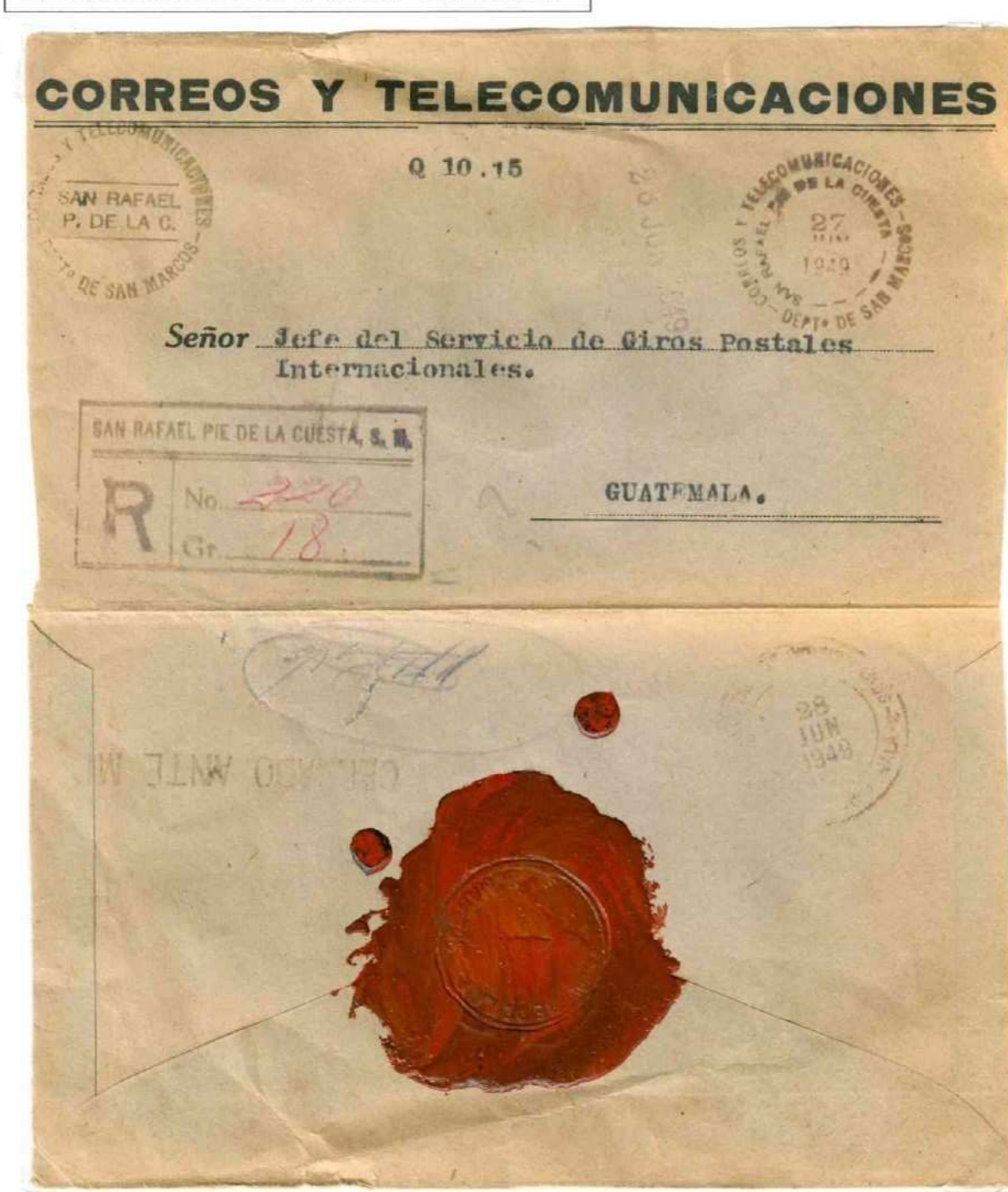
The department of San Marcos is located in region VI or southwestern region, its departmental capital is San Marcos at a distance of 252 kilometers from Guatemala City. It has a territorial extension of 3,791 square kilometers. With a generally temperate climate, although the department has a variety of climates due to its topography, its soil is naturally fertile, unsuitable for all kinds of crops. It was created as a department on May 6, 1866 derived from the request for the district of this name to be elevated to a department. It is divided, including its departmental capital, into 29 municipalities. Some towns of San Marcos settled on pre-Hispanic towns, others were founded and named during the colony, which are mentioned in the chronicle of the time. The communities of Boca and Bocacosta emerged with the coffee boom between 1870 and 1920 when the push for this land began.



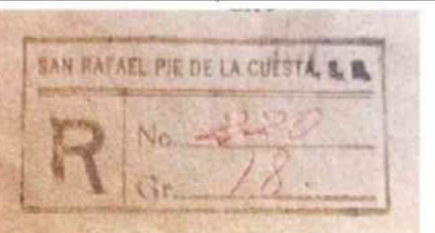

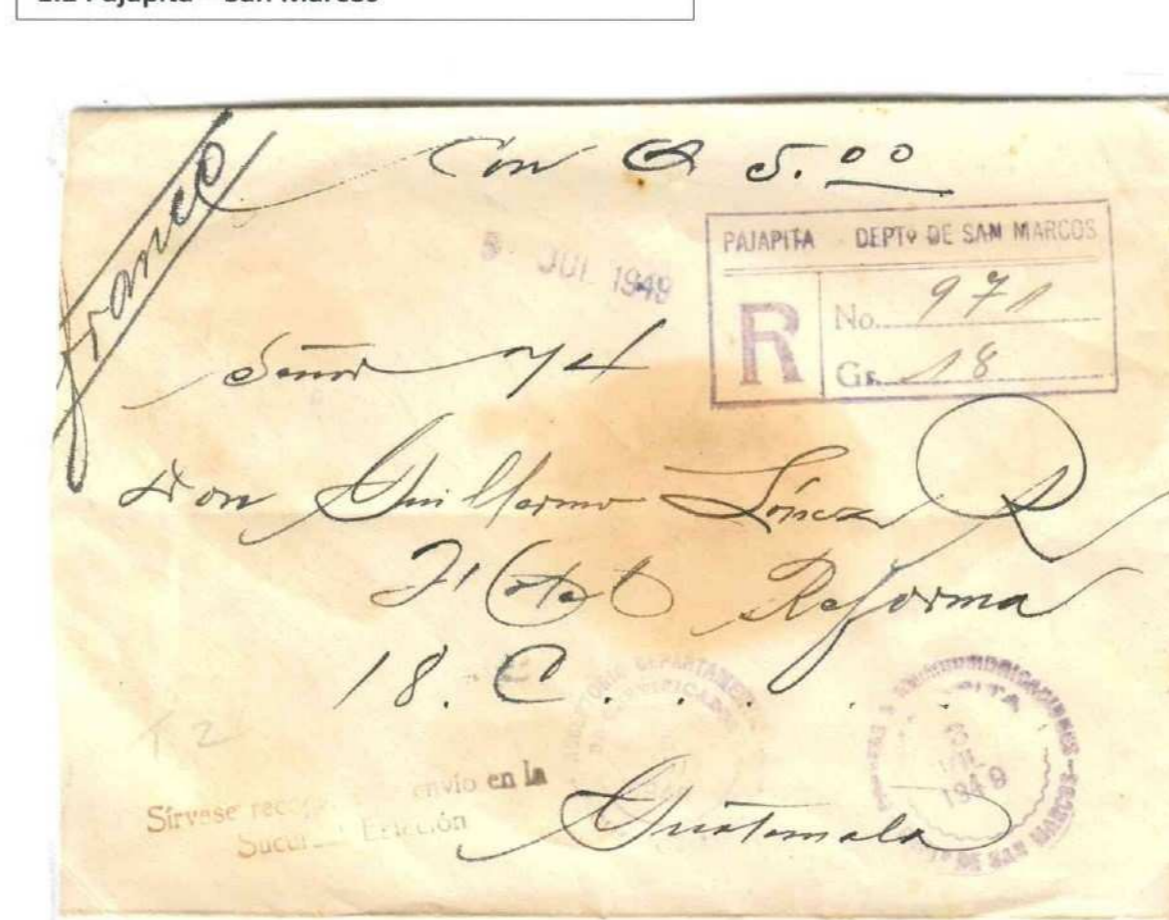

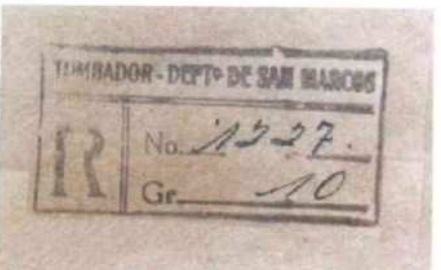

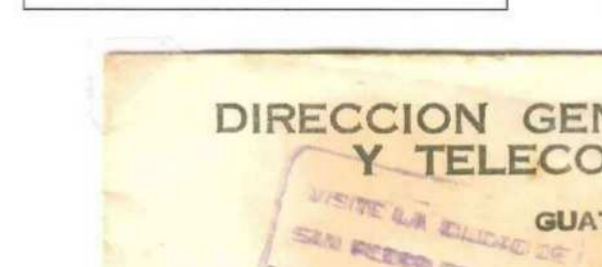

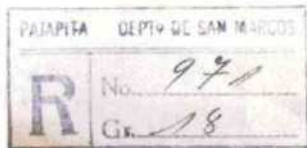
